been on our Eden journey working to abandon our institutional ways of thinking and doing things. The institution was created to care 'efficiently for the masses' and our focus was on routines, schedules and getting our 'work' finished. We must abandon this way of thinking and doing things so that each of the Elders feels like a valued member of our community as we nurture the human spirit as well as the human body. Dr. Thomas calls the Institution a Dragon and when we say and do institutional things we are 'feeding the dragon' and keeping the institution alive. Let's all be Dragon slayers! We need to focus on the things that are going to enhance well-being. If you have any questions please talk to an Eden Associate or a Manager.

"Well-being is a much larger idea than either quality of life or customer satisfaction. It is based on a holistic understanding of human needs and capacities. Well-being is elusive, highly subjective and the most valuable of all human possessions." - Dr. William Thomas, What are old people for?

The Eden Philosophy teaches us that there are 7 domains that create our well -being. They are Identity, Connectedness, Security, Autonomy, Meaning, Growth, and Joy. What is the domain of **GROWTH**? Growth is about development, enrichment, expanding, and self-actualization. Growth comes about through new life experiences and knowledge, and through teaching others. It is about asking elders "is there something you have always wanted to do?" For reflection: 'Is there something that you have always wanted to do?'- If so please tell us – we want to know!
