Principle 10 of the Eden Alternative ® philosophy teaches us that - Wise leadership is the key to meaningful and lasting change. For it, there can be no substitute. Central Haven and Sherbrooke are fortunate communities to have so many wise leaders among us. Leadership is not about positions or titles. True leadership is about each one of us taking responsibility for our own actions and influencing others to bring about posi-

tive change. Together we will make this the best place to live and the best place to work. Elders will grow and live the most full and abundant lives that they are able to. If you have any questions please talk to an Eden Associate or a Manager.

The Eden Philosophy teaches us that there are 7 domains that create our well-being. They are Identity, Connectedness, Security, Autonomy, Meaning, Growth, and Joy. What is the domain of AUTONOMY? Autonomy is about having choice and self-determination, freedom from the arbitrary exercise of authority. Autonomy comes about through a person-directed approach where elders direct their own lives. As staff we realize that we work in the elder's home as opposed to the elder living in our workplace. For reflection: 'What choices are important for you to be making each day of your life here?' 'What helps to alleviate feelings of helplessness if and when you experience those feelings?'
